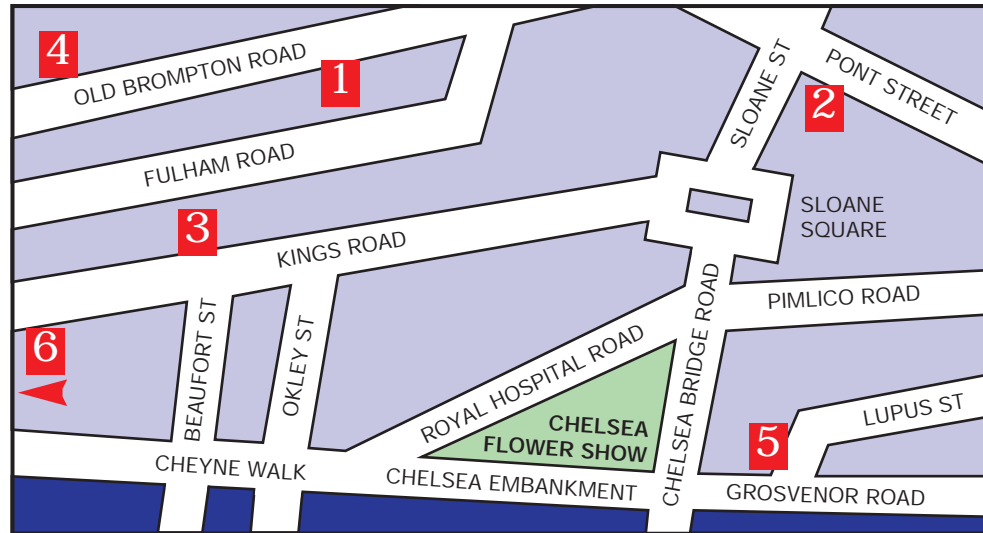

2 DRONES OF PONT STREET

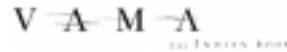
